## Message from the CEO

True victory won is for another. In the past year, we moved one out of every eight victims beyond abuse in New Jersey. This translates to over 2,000 survivors in Middlesex County receiving four times more services than the state average. In an effort to address the barriers our clients face, we have expanded client services to include specialsts in immigration, housing, and special needs. In 2019, we unveiled two sensory stimulation rooms to meet the needs of every child.

Women Aware could not succeed without our partners because teamwork makes the dream work. This past year our legal advocacy staff moved to the County Prosecutor's Office, Victim Witness Unit. This pilot program is well positioned for a future internationally recognized Family Justice Center model. This evidence-based, one-stop shop has been shown to reduce recidivism, as well as domestic violence homicides.

We have only just begun.

Our emergency shelter provided **7,483** bednights for women and children who fled their homes and needed a safe place to go.



Our accessible Safe House served **1 out of 4** mobility impaired and visually impaired victims in the state.



We answered **4,935** hotline calls, providing support, resources and hope for victims in crisis.



Our legal advocates met survivors daily at the Middlesex County Courthouse and helped them secure **629** legal protections against their abusers.



Our Permanent Supportive Housing empowered **three** families who came through the Safe House by providing comprehensive supportive services and a private independent home from which survivors pursue long-term goals such as education and meaningful employment.




